#### **Reflection for Second Sunday of Easter**

A man was brought to Mercy Hospital for surgery. The operation went well. The nun waiting by his bed said to the man, "You're going to be just fine," and asked him, "We want to know how you intend to pay for your stay here. Are you covered by insurance?" He whispered, "No, I'm not." The nun asked, "Can you pay in cash?" He replied, "I'm afraid I can't, Sister." She continued, "Do you have any close relatives, then?" The patient replied, "Just my sister in New Mexico, but she's a spinster nun." The nun said, "Nuns are not spinsters, Mr. Smith. They are married to God." The man said with a smile, "Okay, then send the bill to my brother-in-law." On this second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate the Divine Mercy. Both Catholics and some Anglicans observe this feast. The Divine Mercy devotion is based on Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun's encounters with Jesus. The Divine Mercy devotion is associated with the special promises made by Jesus to Faustina and through the indulgences granted by the Church. According to Faustina's vision, those who receive communion and attend confession on the Feast of Mercy receive total forgiveness of sins.

In the Jubilee Year 2000, Saint John Paul II established this new feast indicating that he was fulfilling the will of Christ. He believed that our Church needed to re-emphasize the tremendous gift of Divine Mercy that the Lord pours out on every one of us. Divine Mercy is part of the whole story of redemption. This comes out clearly when we read "for God so love the world, that he sent His only Son" (John 3:16). Jesus' mission was to make God's mercy visible, accessible, and comprehensible. The Blood and water from his side pierced by a spear (John 19:34) invoke the Divine Mercy that is given to the humanity from the cross of Jesus. Both symbolize the grace of sacraments: help and forgiveness (cf. Diary 299). This is also the meaning of the red and white ray in the Divine Mercy image.

Jesus said to His Apostles in today's gospel: "Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." The Holy Spirit will unveil God's salvation plan and the proclamation of his Divine Mercy by his Church. Jesus gave this authority to the Apostles on the night of the Resurrection. Thomas was not there that night. The next time Jesus visited; Thomas was there. The drama of his encounter with Jesus was graphic.

Jesus' let Thomas touch him and feel his wounds and humanness. The Divine mercy is about God revealing himself to us, forgiving us, and not condemning us even in our doubts.

As Pope Francis would say, the Divine Mercy leads us through Christ's wounds into the mystery of God's love. Also, we come to realize that mercy is not simply one of God's qualities among others, but the very beating of his heart. Therefore, the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday is an opportunity to reflect on the theme of how God's mercy can overcome sin and the special invitation to all Christians to face the world with confidence in divine benevolence.

## DID YOU KNOW...

What is happening in the diocese to protect children?

• Training is provided for all adults and youth to identify warning signs and develop strategies for maintaining a safe environment for all.

• A designated Review Board Administrator and Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to receive reports and accompany victims through their journey.

• A volunteer independent Review Board assists the bishop in the review of cases and makes recommendations for moving forward.

• A Safe Environment Coordinator assists parish and school personnel with training and background screenings for anyone who may have access to children.

• An audit is conducted by an independent firm to evaluate the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Findings are incorporated with those of other dioceses and made available in an Annual Report.
