

# FROM THE PASTOR...

## FR. LINUS UMOREN. C.M.

### Reflection for the Twentieth Sunday of Ordinary Time in Year A

A four-year-old boy was asked by his mother what he had learned in Bible school where the theme was Discipleship and Saving Mother Earth. He said, "It was all about Jesus and the 12 recycles.

The story of the Canaanite woman that we read this weekend is very shocking at first. The story opens with a picture of Jesus who does not have time for people outside his inner circle of follower. His engagement with the woman is scandalous, especially referring to her as a dog. She is simply asking for help for her daughter who is possessed by demons, and yet Jesu calls her a dog—a name that the Jews called Gentiles. This attitude opens the questions about prejudice and God's choice of Israel.

Jesus was raised in a culture of separation by race, gender, class, and ethnicity... just like every one of us. And like a typical Jew in a relationship with "the others", he makes the woman in the story to see herself as not part of the chosen people of God. "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." (Mathew 15: 26 NAB). The very name Canaanite roused memories of foes and idol worshippers in the sensibility of the Jews. Moreover, that the woman lived in a pagan territory made her unclean. Jesus' Jewish identity is well established here, and we cannot "de-Judaize" him. However, our understanding of Jesus and his mission must begin from his cultural and historical personality.

However, there is another interesting twist in the story. It is not about Jesus taking initiative to a gentile mission but about a Gentile woman who believes she can be part of God's plan of salvation. By so doing she describes what faith is like—the substance of things we hope for and the evidence of things we do not see.

The woman's persistence takes us to another and a more complete portrait of Jesus. She kneels at his feet; she pleads with him; and she does not take no for an answer. She loved her child and wanted a healing for her so badly. She knew and believed that Jesus could heal her child. The complete portrait of Jesus here is that though he was a Jew, he is also fully the son of God, merciful and compassionate. The grace of God is not limited by culture or gender or color. Jesus crossed the boundary of culture and gender through the agency of one whose demands challenged such limitation.

In our deeply polarized society, people who are different from us are easily misunderstood or dismissed. But Christians must decide if they must let go of their cultural boundaries, organized plan and respond to the needs that arise in the community unannounced. Jesus' love and compassion have no boundaries. The graciousness of God shatters the division and barriers that emerge out of human experience. *God is good all the time; all the time God is good!*






