Reflection for the Twenty-first Sunday of the Year

A drunk walks up to two priests... He says "I'm Jesus Christ. "The priest shakes his head. "No son, you're not." The drunk goes up to the second priest. "I'm Jesus Christ." The second priest gives the same answer. The drunk glares at them for a second. "Look I can prove it. Follow me." He leads them to a bar and walks inside. The bartender takes one look at him and says, "Jesus Christ, you're here AGAIN?!"

This weekend, the readings from Isaiah and Matthew's gospel deal with issues related to election to office, fitness for office, giving power to others, and exercising power.

The context of the first reading is the gradual disintegration of the Israel before the Babylonian exile. This period was marked by political tension, selfishness, and chaos. Thus, Isaiah criticizes Shebna for his failure to be the ideal King's treasurer. As a result, Eliakim is chosen to take the place of Shebna. He is to be the "father to the inhabitant of Jerusalem and the house of Israel." As an ideal ruler he is to bring true justice, love, and compassion to the people.

In the same way, the Gospel's setting is Caesarea Philippi. This city was founded by Philip the Tetrarch son of Herod the great. In 20 BC Herod the great received the whole district from Augustus and dedicated a temple in honor of the emperor. The dialogue at Caesarea Philippi exposed the illegitimacy of the claim that Caesar, the Roman emperor was omnipotent. Peter's response "you are the Christ, the Son of the living God" is a recognition of Christ as he real king and the rejection of the kingdom of Caesar. Thus, Peter identifies Christ as the king who rules with justice, love, and compassion.

Peter is praised for acknowledging the Messiah. He is given the name Rock. However, if he refuses to participate in Christ's suffering leadership of Jesus and reverts to imperial behavior, he loses his role. Consequently, Peter learns from his weakness when he is rebuked and called a stumbling block precisely because he wants to remove the cross from the mission of the Christ and Christian discipleship. That reminds me of the 1951 movie titled Quo Vadis which is set in ancient Rome during the final years of Emperor Nero's reign. During Nero's persecution, of Christians, Peter saw that he was in mortal danger and decided to get out of Rome. As he fled from the city along the Appian Way, he ran right into Jesus who was headed in the opposite direction – toward Rome.

Seeing this, Peter who puts a question to Jesus: "Domine, quo vadis?" (Where are you going, Lord?), and Jesus answers, "I am going to Rome to be crucified." Peter, chastened, turned on his heels and headed back to Rome. Therefore, we must not only believe in Christ, but also put His Kingdom values into our lives and society. We can't live our faith fully without taking on the challenges of our contemporary society, rejecting its values and moral spin while striving for the Kingdom where Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.

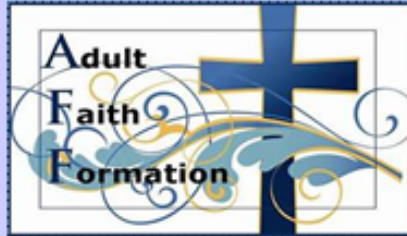

RESPECT LIFE CORNER ***So, is the death penalty wrong?***

The Catechism teaches, “in the light of the Gospel, that ‘the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person.’”

While the death penalty “was long considered an appropriate response to the gravity of certain crimes,” its use is no longer necessary to safeguard the common good. The Catechism notes that in our modern world, “more effective systems of detention have been developed, which ensure the due protection of citizens but, at the same time, do not definitively deprive the guilty of the possibility of redemption.” No sin or crime is greater than God’s mercy. The sacrifice of the Cross reveals that Christ’s greatest desire is to forgive those with a repentant heart. (CCC 2267)

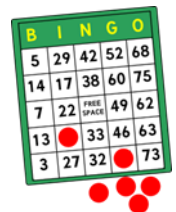

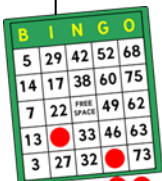
