# Reflection for the Third Sunday of Advent B

Little Jonny swallowed a nickel. The mother said to Jonny's father, "Henry, call the doctor." "No, I think we ought to call the minister quick, he can get money out of anybody."

For the last two Sundays our attention has been directed toward the preparation of the coming of Christ. The third Sunday focuses our attention much more on the Lord already present among us. This weekend is known as 'Gaudete (Rejoice!) Sunday', and rose vestments are worn to signal the joy realized in our liturgy today. We light the rose-colored candle in the Advent wreath symbolizing our joy as we await the coming of our Savior. We rejoice because the day of salvation is nearby.

This weekend's Gospel presents John the Baptist again as a model disciple. He heralds the coming of Christ and announces the good news that Christ is the word of God made flesh. The message of this season is that God is coming to us. If God is coming to us, we must not let the situation we find ourselves make us unable to find and celebrate him. Probably, we have made up our mind that this year's Christmas is not going to be as meaningful or as joyful as the previous Christmases have been. This can be because of the experience of some bad and tragic moments in life or the loss of a dear one over this year. Consequently, we feel empty. Moreover, there are some people who will not be able to attend the Christmas mass and listen to the traditional Christmas carols because they are home bound. They already feel a sense of emptiness and meaninglessness. How do we find joy in all these? It can be challenging.

Nevertheless, we must not conclude that we have nothing to celebrate. We must not let the darkness of the world cover God's light. The joy of Jesus and the joy of Christmas can only be ours to the extent that we discover what inner joy means. Inner joy is discovered in knowing the goodness of God. Thus, when a Christian looks at the world, and sees the love of God at work—not just the evil in the form of disease, violence, and poverty, that Christian radiates inner joy. When they see God's glory, His compassion, and His love shining through the darkness of our world, that Christian is ready to celebrate Christ whose coming into our history has transformed the human story and experience.
