From the pastor...

First Sunday of Advent-Year B

A priest was greeting parishioners on their way out of the Church after mass. He had a patch on his chin. "I am sorry about the bandage, what happened Father?" asked one concerned parishioner. "Oh, I cut my chin shaving thinking about my sermon," replied the priest. Suddenly a voice behind the line said, "Next time, why not think about your chin and cut the sermon?"

This weekend, Catholics and some other Christians all over the world begin a new liturgical year: Cycle B. The liturgical year always begins with the season of Advent.

Unfortunately for most Christians, the season of Advent is not as significant as the secular activities of the period between Thanksgiving and Christmas. During this period, people talk more about Black Friday sales, Cyber Monday sales, and Christmas sales.

However, the time of Advent which goes mostly unnoticed by many people invites us to enter into a daily reflection and seek out space to live the hope of the expected Messiah. The season brings us gradually to the door of Bethlehem where God's love and humility are personified in the mystery of the incarnation. During the four weeks prior to Christmas, we light the candles of our Advent wreaths and put ourselves in the spiritual space of the Israelites who, through many centuries, waited for the coming of the Messiah.

The readings of this Advent season take us through the state of the world into which God becomes flesh and dwells among us. The stories that lead us to the in-breaking of God into human history put Angel Gabriel, John the Baptist, Joseph, and Mary as central figures and instruments of God's mystery.

This weekend, the parish will bless the advent wreath. The wreath is a Christian tradition that symbolizes the passage of the four weeks of Advent such that each candle is lit on each of the weekends of Advent. Many Advent wreaths also have a white candle, the fifth in the center sometimes known as the "Christ candle." This is lit on Christmas day. Thus, in Advent, we celebrate the four pillars of Christmas: hope, peace, love, and Joy, and of course, on Christmas day, we celebrate Christ the Emmanuel.




