FROM THE PASTOR...

Reflection for Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

The preacher's sermon was on the Ten Commandments. When he reached "Thou shalt not steal," he noticed one of his parishioners, became very agitated. When the preacher reached "Thou shalt not commit adultery," the man suddenly smiled and relaxed. After the service, the preacher approached the man and asked him the reason for his peculiar behavior. The man replied with an embarrassed smile, "When you talked about the commandment "Thou shalt not steal," I suddenly discovered my umbrella was missing. But when you said "Thou shalt not commit adultery", I remembered where I left it." The Parable of the Sower which we read this weekend can be found only in three of the four gospels. Mathew, Mark, and Luke record this parable with a slight difference that is not significant. Some commentators have suggested that the parable could have been called the Parable of the Soil. The parable is not about the Sower or the seed but about the ground where the seed fell. The Sower merely walks along his familiar path throwing his seed into the soil.

However, the modern American farmer would carefully prepare the soil with the right pH balance first. (The soil pH indicates the acidity of the soil. A healthy, productive farm is created from the ground up. The Soil pH above 7 is alkaline and contains more negatively charged hydroxide ions. The soil pH is important to know because it determines the availability of almost all essential plant nutrients). He only injects the seed into the soil after treating the soil.

In Jesus' time, the farmers would cast the seed and then plow the land. With this method, the seed could fall wherever. The Sower's intention is not to waste his seeds. He hopes for a better season when harvest time comes. But regardless of the good seeds and the Sower's intention, some seeds sown in the scattering method will land on soil with less favorable conditions. Jesus warns that the human heart is like receptive soil to the seed of God's word. There is the hard heart, the shallow heart, the crowded heart, and the fruitful heart.

The parable of the Sower ends with the invitation to listen—"Whoever has ears ought to hear." Hear what? Blessed are your eyes because they see and your ears because they hear.

The parable of the Sower is not merely pragmatic. It also conveys the idea of God's promise. There is always fertile soil. The confident disciple's focus should not be on the good effort that fails but on celebrating the abundant harvest that is produced. There are many things in life that we lose, and there many things we gain. What we achieve, we must celebrate as God's blessing.


