## FROM THE PASTOR... FR. LINUS UMOREN, C.M.

#### Reflection for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Johnny, a very bright 5-year-old, told his daddy he'd like to have a baby brother and, along with his request, offered to do whatever he could to help. His dad, a very bright 35-year-old, paused for a moment and then replied, "I'll tell you what, Johnny, if you pray every day for two months for a baby brother, I guarantee that God will give you one!" Johnny responded eagerly to his dad's challenge and went to his bedroom early that night to start praying for a baby brother. He prayed every night for a whole month, but after that time, he began to get skeptical. He checked around the neighborhood and found out that what he thought was going to happen, had never occurred in the history of the neighborhood. You just don't pray for two months and then, whammo- a new baby brother. So, Johnny quit praying. After another month, Johnny's mother went to the hospital. When she came back home, Johnny's parents called him into the bedroom. He cautiously walked into the room, not expecting to find anything, and there was a little bundle lying right next to his mother. His dad pulled back the blanket and there was -- not one baby brother, but two!! His mother had twins! Johnny's dad looked down at him and said, "Now aren't you glad you prayed?" Johnny hesitated a little and then looked up at his dad and said, "Yes, but aren't you glad I quit when I did?"

There is something I have grown to be comfortable with in life; it is the fact that the world never stops moving and changing. Day in and day out, everything keeps changing, people grow, emotions swing, and inventions get complex. As these things continue to change, we feel restless and dissatisfied with life. Restlessness has many faces. Sometimes it appears as if the whole world and its problems are on our shoulders. Other times, we feel so obsessed about a relationship that isn't really ours to have. Moreover, restlessness can fire us beyond our boundaries and when this happens, we feel that no one understands us.

There is a piece of good news in today's gospel passage. Jesus reaches out to people who are weary and restless in life. He says, "...come to me and learn from me. I am meek and humble of heart." (Matthew 11:29 NAB) Does life seem to drain you of energy, spirit, and of love? Are you overpowered by anxiety and there seems to be no way out? Jesus tells us that worry can be self-consuming. Like "Batman," we would like to fly, be in different places, and possess all that our heart desires. Unfortunately, we eventually find ourselves in a limited situation. But is God in control and does he understand us? I believe He does. Therefore, when we are weary with too much to do, the grace of God steps in to stabilize us. When we face tough decisions, God gives us the counseling we need. When we are exhausted by setbacks, God gives us hope. And when we grieve the death of a dear one, faith in the resurrection keeps us strong. Human life is not completely easy. That is why as people of faith, we are invited to constantly thank those in our lives who support and inspire us. At the same time, our challenging experiences bring us to the learning desk so that we can have even more reasons to give thanks to the God who loves us.


