FROM THE PASTOR.... FR. LINUS UMOREN, C.M.

Reflection on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

A four-year-old was in church when the wine and communion wafers were passed out. He was very interested in this and started to get up. His mother leaned over and told him that he was not old enough to partake in the Communion.

Later, when the collection plate came by, he ignored it. His mother again leaned over and tried to coax the nickel out of him. He steadfastly refused, stating, "If I can't eat, I'm not paying." The Solemnity of the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ assumes a particular attention as we begin the National year of Eucharistic revival.

What is Eucharistic revival? The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the United States to the divine invitation of re-centering our lives on the Real Presence of the Eucharist. Based on the revival's four "pillars," "four invitations" for the parish year are: reinvigorating worship, personal encounter, robust faith formation and missionary sending. We will take these themes one by one as we go through the year.

Several times, people have asked me to explain the word "Transubstantiation" to them. Transubstantiation is the doctrine that teaches that the bread and the wine after the prayer of consecration by the priest at Mass, substantially assume a new spiritual essence—the body and blood of Christ. Like the disciples of Jesus, many people have difficulty understanding and believing in this spiritual essence or new reality. In John's gospel chapter 6, Jesus teaches about the bread of life by explicitly talking about "eating his flesh" and "drinking his blood." Many were disturbed by his words. "When many of his disciples heard it, they said, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, said to them, "Do you take offense at this?... The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life (John 6:60-70 NAB).

The bread and wine become a real presence of Jesus in the community of believers celebrating the Eucharist. This happens through the power of the words spoken by the priest, just as he commanded them to do. The bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ which are, in turn, meant to transform us when we receive them. Therefore, each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we memorize the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, we give thanks for such great gift, and we commune together at a common meal, also around Jesus who is actively present through the Eucharistic sacrifice. The Eucharist is a "symbolic reality" of Christ continuous presence in the Church. Whenever we eat the bread and wine at the Eucharist celebration (or brought to us at home or the hospital), we receive into ourselves the very life of Christ. The opening words from the website of the National Eucharistic revival suggest, that our world is hurting, and we all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. Therefore, Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist (<u>https://eucharisticrevival.org/)</u>. How we can return is the reason for the Eucharistic Revival.

At the end of 8:30am Mass THIS Sunday, being Corpus Christi, we will expose the Blessed Sacrament, and close with Benediction.

A Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is the service in which Jesus Christ is adored in the consecrated Host exposed on the altar, after the priest has incensed the consecrated Host and in which the priest blesses the faithful with the Sacred Host. The liturgy includes singing the ancient Latin hymns, O Salutaris and Tantum Ergo (O saving victim and Down in Adoration) followed by the benediction proper. The celebrant holds the monstrance wearing a humeral veil covering his shoulders, arms and hands, and then blesses the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament by tracing the sign of the cross with the monstrance held steadily upright before him. The liturgy concludes with the <u>Divine Praises</u> and singing the Holy God we praise they name.


