## FROM THE PASTOR.... FR. LINUS UMOREN, C.M.

#### Reflection for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary time

A woman at the airport waiting to catch her flight bought herself a bag of cookies, settled in a chair in the airport lounge and began to read her book. Suddenly she noticed the man beside her helping himself with cookies from the cookie bag between them. Not wanting to make a scene, she read on, ate cookies, and watched the clock. As the daring "cookie thief" kept on eating the cookies she got more irritated and said to herself, "If I wasn't so nice, I'd blacken his eye!" With each cookie she took, he took one too. When only one was left, she wondered what he would do. Then with a smile on his face and a nervous laugh, he took the last cookie and broke it in half. He offered her half, and he ate the other. She snatched it from him and thought, "Oh brother, this guy has some nerve, and he's also so rude, why, he didn't even show any gratitude!" She sighed with relief when her flight was called. She gathered her belongings and headed for the gate, refusing to look at the ungrateful "thief." She boarded the plane and sank in her seat, then reached in her baggage to fetch her book, and what she saw made her gasp with surprise. For there in front of her eyes was her bag of cookies. Then it dawned on her that the cookies she ate in the lounge was the man's and not hers, that the man was not rude but a friend who tried to share, that she was the rude one and the ungrateful one.

This weekend Jesus inaugurates a new dimension to his mission. He invites his disciples to be part of his mission. He sends them out to continue to do what he himself had been doing.

Matthew uses the word apostle for the Twelve. Apostle means "one who is sent." Thus, Matthew draws our attention to the mission of the twelve much more than their personal traits and heritage. Through the mission of the Apostles Jesus intends that the sick be cured, lepers be cleansed, demons be driven out, and the dead be raised to life. What is interesting here is the transition of the mission from the Father to the Son, and to the Apostles or the Church. Moreover, they are to begin from the known land to the unknown land, "Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel." This raises the question as to the best place to begin mission? Is mission primarily about going to a distant country or another city? Who is a missionary? Imagine that Mission begins where we find ourselves. It begins with the person who sits with us on the plane or works with us in the office. As the Church is sent by Jesus to the world, every member of the Church is a missionary whose mission is to preach the love of Christ. "The kingdom of Heaven is at hand." Imagine how many people have been cured, how many demons have been driven out, and how many dead have been raised through simple acts of charity.
