Reflection on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

Hey Mason! Were you able to talk to your dad about the... "Boy! This week is Trinity Sunday. Dad took so long trying to explain the Trinity, I didn't have the heart to ask him about the electoral college."

The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity celebrates the foundation of our faith. The Trinity is a term that the Christian theologians, especially in the patristic era coined to talk about God who reveals himself in a relationship. Thus, the feast leads us to the understanding of the true nature of God. From the early Church, the mystery of the Trinity is explained in so many ways, including philosophical and anthropological analogies. For example, it has been argued that the revelation of God is either supplemented or superseded by later revelation which shows the one God in some sense to be three "persons." None of these explanations has been able to define the essence of the Trinity completely. Though we may never fully comprehend the nature of the Trinity, we can describe the manifestation of God in three distinct persons: The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Most Christian prayers begin with the direct invocation of the Trinity or any of the three persons of the Trinity. The history of God's people reveals a God who desires to enter an intimate relationship with his people; a God who comes into their account not just as a transcendent being, but always present as God made flesh. Jesus teaches about the nature of God in his willingness to forgive us, adopts us and empowers us with the Holy Spirit. Most of what we know about God's life is revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. He teaches about God with emphasis on their relationship. In Jesus Christ, God is Our Father, who art in Heaven. The Trinity then is an expression of the relationship that exists between the Father and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and by extension, with all adopted sons and daughters of God.

We know that God creates because we are immersed in the mystery of creation. We know that He saves because we have experienced the salvific work of Jesus. We also know that God sustains and cares for us through the gift of love in the world. Our faith in the Trinitarian God is an invitation to experience God in His distinct self-expression. The God of history who has revealed himself to communities and individuals through the ages in separate ways continues to act here and now as God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.



At the end of 8:30 Mass next Sunday being Corpus Christi, we will expose the Blessed Sacrament, and close with Benediction.

A Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is the service in which Jesus Christ is adored in the consecrated Host exposed on the altar, after the priest has incensed the consecrated Host and in which the priest blesses the faithful with the Sacred Host. The liturgy includes singing the ancient Latin hymns, O Salutaris and Tantum Ergo (O saving victim and Down in Adoration) followed by the benediction proper. The celebrant holds the monstrance wearing a humeral veil covering his shoulders, arms and hands, and then blesses the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament by tracing the sign of the cross with the monstrance held steadily upright before him. The liturgy concludes with the <u>Divine Praises</u> and singing the Holy God we praise they name.

This is to inaugurate the National year of the Eucharistic revival.



Based on the revival's four "pillars," "four invitations" for the parish year are:

reinvigorating worship, personal encounter, robust faith formation and missionary sending. We will take these themes one by one as we go through the year.
