FROM THE PASTOR.... FR. LINUS UMOREN, C.M.

Reflection for Fifth Sunday of Lent - year A

Saint Peter is talking with God about three guys who are about to enter heaven. "They're not very smart, but they are nice, and I'm not sure I should let them in our not." God says, "well we do have standards here. Ask them some simple questions and if they answer correctly let them in." Peter greets the men and asks the first one, "tell me what Christmas is for?" The man says, "Oh, oh! That's when we put on costumes and go around and collect candy. That's my favorite holiday." "Sorry," Peter says and gestures towards the sign with the arrow pointing down. He asked the next man, "What is Thanksgiving about?" Guy says, "I got this. Turkey. We eat turkey and then we open all these presents that have piled up underneath the tree. We celebrate that guy's birthday; give me a minute I'll think of his name." Peter shakes his head and points to the same sign. Then he looks at the last guy and says, "Tell me what the purpose of Easter is?" The man wrinkles his brow and closes his eyes, thinking hard. His face lights up and he explains, "That is when a Jesus rolls the stone away from the grave, walks outside and if He sees His shadow there will be six more weeks of winter."

The story of the raising of Lazarus is the third long narrative in the gospel of John, which we read during Lent. Interestingly, it is only John's Gospel that reports the raising of Lazarus. There are many interesting characters in the narrative: Jesus, his disciples, Martha, Mary, Lazarus, and a group of Jews who come to mourn Lazarus' death. But of all these characters, it is Martha who speaks our "common language": "Lord, if only you had been here, my brother would not have died." When we are faced with situations that we deem unbearable, it is easy to question the existence of God. Some people would argue, If God were present in our society or perhaps if He cared as we believe, he would not allow so many people to die of cancer.

Martha, like many us today, believe that God is in control of the affairs of the world. He can heal our brokenness, and he can speak a word, and everything would come to a stop. Martha was convinced that if Jesus had arrived early, he could have healed Lazarus, and he would not have died. But He chose to arrive late, and Martha could not understand. Therefore, Martha knows what it is like to experience frustration, pains, and uncertainty. However, she speaks to Jesus, who identifies himself as "the resurrection and life" in a hopeful tone. "I know my brother will rise again" Nonetheless, Jesus speaks of the resurrection as a present reality—"I am," which makes Martha, Mary, and those present fascinated about the hope of a new life.

As we live side by side with pain, suffering and death in this life, Martha invites us to trust Jesus, who is the resurrection and life, and with whom all things are possible. She does not promise us that everything will be instantly restored, and the dead come back to life like her brother, Lazarus. But she suggests that there is one greater than the world that we can always trust. He has the final answer.
