



Reflection for Second Sunday of Lent

The preacher's 5-year-old daughter noticed that her preacher father always paused and bowed his head for a moment before starting his sermon. One day she asked him why. "Well, Honey," he began, proud that his daughter was so observant of his messages, "I'm asking the Lord to help me to preach a good sermon." "Well then, how come He doesn't do it?" she asked.

Our Gospel this weekend narrates the story of the Transfiguration. In this event, God reveals himself so that we can know him as he is. Consequently, God is not removed from our world; His glory is with us. In the event of the transfiguration Jesus "face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white." This scene is beautiful and amazing. Thus, the apostles are surprised because they see the glory of God and feel the mystery of God's love. God speaks from out of the cloud saying, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him. This proclamation is an invitation to the disciples to participate in the very mystery of Christ's sonship.

Christianity is a religion of relationship with God and with each other. Moses and Elijah who

appear in a conversation with Jesus symbolize the eternity of life in the divine person. Moreover, the Law and the prophet converge in the person of Christ. Therefore, when we listen to Christ, we claim our true place in the divine life, and realize our essential connection to others.

The season of Lent calls us listen to Jesus and to see him in his glory. However, the 21st century culture makes us think that we've got it all figured out because of technological capabilities. As a result, we are unable to recognize the glory of the Lord even when it is revealed to us. There are things happening all around us all the time that continue to reveal the working of God.

Perhaps during this season, we may ask ourselves these questions: Are we giving God sufficient time to speak to us? Is there any way I can see His glory in the world? Jesus is always with us when we are afraid and when we suffer. He is with us when we can't feel His presence or his love for us. He is also there for us when we are having difficulty finding purpose in our lives. It might take us time to come to this knowledge. It took the apostles a long time to get to know Jesus and the longer they were with Him the better they got to know him. The same thing happens to us. We also grow gradually in our understanding of Jesus and in understanding what He is asking of us. Today in his Transfiguration, he promises that if we journey with him, he will change our lowly bodies to be like his glorious body in the resurrection.

Scrip cards make great gifts and in addition, consider purchasing "scrip cards" to use in place of cash, checks or credit cards for purchases you make.
