By now, you have noticed our "new" parking lot. After many years of disrepair and crumbling surface, the parking lot has been 100% replaced. Next on the "to-do" list are some painting projects on buildings at the cemetery and repairs and repainting of damaged areas within the church interior.

In early February, we submitted a Resolution to the Diocese of Belleville in which we notified them of our intent to complete these projects. The Resolution was approved, signed, and returned to us just after Easter. This allowed us to move on with our projects.

In this Resolution we asked for the opportunity to receive donations from our parishioners up to the maximum cost which would then be non-taxed by the Diocese.

This means that we can receive up to \$45,997.31 (broken down between parking lot \$35,382.31 and Church painting/repair \$10,615.00) with no taxes being assessed.

FROM THE PASTOR...

Reflection for Sixth Sunday of Easter: A

Happy mother day to all women. I say all women because in my opinion, every woman is either a biological or spiritual mother or a model of motherhood. They significantly teach us what practical love feels like.

A child asked his father, "How were people born?" So his father said, "Adam and Eve made babies, then their babies became adults and made babies, and so on." The child then went to his mother, asked her the same question and she told him, "We were monkeys then we evolved to become like we are now." The child ran back to his father and said, "You lied to me!" His father replied, "No, your mom was talking about her side of the family."

The gospel discourse this weekend begins with the statement: "If you love me, you will keep my commandment." (John 14:15 NRSV) This statement is part of Jesus farewell message to his disciples. Now, what is Jesus implying when he states that loving him means you will keep his commandment?

To understand the implication of this commandment, let us return to the great mandate of Jesus in the thirteenth chapter of John's Gospel: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13: 34 NRSV). Jesus' commandment directs us to love of one another. And the love Jesus wants his disciples to embrace is not the abstract kind of love. It is the practical love that understands the pains and the joys of others. It is the practical love of listening, hearing and understanding the other in "his language." When I think of my mother and the women in my life, whom I work with, I see this kind of love— a love that listens, hears and understands.

Jesus' story of love is not just about him and the glory of the Father. We see Jesus operating in the community of real people. He walked the streets of Galilee, he ate the food, he kept the festivals and connected with all classes of people (the rich, the poor and the middle class.) Jesus was present with real people who sometimes struggled to get along and at other times he enjoyed sharing their success story. He understood their hopes and disappointments. Could this be the kind of love that Jesus is talking about? Yes! Jesus is asking for a movement from the experience of the mystical love to the experience of the real love and its frustrations. It is easy to think of love and feel loved when all goes well and our expectations are met by those who love us.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta in her record of life experience gave an indication of her spiritual struggle to understand love in the midst of chaos. The love Jesus commands is not a feeling but a commitment to see God everywhere, in everybody, in everything and at all times. There is no guarantee that it will be easy but there is an assurance that we will not be left to ourselves: "I will not leave you orphaned; I will come to you ... because I live and you will live." (John 14: 18 NAB). What if we were to understand Jesus's words and definition of love in this way?


