Reflection for the Seventh Sunday of the Easter (Ascension of the Lord)

During a Sunday school lesson, a child learned about how God created human beings. The child became especially focused when the teacher explained how Eve was created from Adam's ribs. Later in the week, the boy's mother saw him lying down on the floor, so she asked him what was wrong. His reply was priceless: "Mom, I have a pain in my side—I think I'm getting a wife.

The ascension of the Lord is celebrated 40 days after the resurrection of Christ. The feast of Ascension sustains the hope that one day, we shall be where Christ is. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), "... Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into His Father's glorious kingdom, so that we the members of his body may live in the hope of one day being with him forever" (CCC 665-667).

The Biblical accounts of the ascension focus not so much on the event's details as on the mission Jesus gave to his disciples. One would notice, for example, that Luke places the

location of the ascension in Jerusalem while Mathew and Mark say that it took place in Galilee. However, what is essential in these narratives is the substance that the Lord Jesus ascended to heaven, and his disciples witnessed it. More so, Luke is interested in indicating that the earthly presence of Jesus came to an end at a specific time. Consequently, before He departed, Jesus gave the divine instruction to the apostles, "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait there for what the Father has promised." The promise of the father had a purpose. As long as we live, our lives will change. Things will change around us. The Greek philosopher Heraclitus is credited with the idea that the only constant in life is change. Thus, no one can avoid change. It comes in different form and, sometimes, when we are not prepared for it. When things change, we grieve the loss. And like the disciples, we look up and worried about what we once had, which now is no more. Moreover, we become restless about where we go from there and what happens to us next. When Jesus ascended to heaven, while in the state of perplexity, the Angel spoke to the disciples, saying, "This Jesus who has been taken up to heaven will return again in the same way that you saw him go." One way we can understand this is that when things change, it opens the door for new possibilities and opportunities. This is where Jesus' instructions to his disciples makes sense: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait there for what the Father has promised." The promise of the father is to make all things new. The mission of the Holy Spirit is to transform our human condition and direct us to the eternal plan of God. Therefore, when things change, we must look for those places where new possibilities emerge. For example, when someone we love walks away from us or leaves us through death, the way forward is not to stand there looking up in despair but to pick up the pieces and trust that there is a new way to live, a new path to joy, and new relationships to support us. However, we would need to discover this path through the power of the Holy Spirit.

2023 GOLD RUSH RAFFLE







DID YOU KNOW...



MAY 27TH- Feast of St. Augustine of Canterbury

Augustine of Canterbury comes across today as a very human saint, one who could suffer like many of us from a failure of nerve. For example, his first venture to England ended in a big U-turn back to Rome. He made mistakes and met failure in his peacemaking attempts with the Briton Christians. He often wrote to Rome for decisions on matters he could have decided on his own had he been more self-assured. He even received mild warnings against pride from Pope Gregory, who cautioned him to "fear lest, amidst the wonders that are done, the weak mind be puffed up by self-esteem." Augustine's perseverance amidst obstacles and only partial success teaches today's apostles and pioneers to struggle on despite frustrations and be satisfied with gradual advances.
