Reflection for the Thirty-Second Sunday of the Year A

Attending a wedding for the first time, a little girl whispered to her mother, "Why is the bride dressed in white?" "Because white is the color of happiness, and today is the happiest day of her life." The child thought about this for a moment, then said, "So why is the groom wearing black?"

The parable of the ten virgins in this weekend's gospel is full of wonderful images of God's judgment. Like every other parable about the last days, Jesus does not mean to frighten us in the parable but to give us the tools that we need for the coming of God's Kingdom. Thus, the parable reveals a tension between planning for the future and living in the present. The present is part of the future as much as the future informs the present. Jesus demands that we act now and that we be prepared for the future without losing focus. Jesus' parable invites us into an awakening, an awareness of the world around us, and the coming of God into that world. We are to wait with true anticipation and hopeful disposition for the kingdom to come.

The ten virgins in the parable had equal opportunities. Five chose to think and act in a conventional manner—they had just enough oil in their lamps. Their attitude was, "Whatever happens, we will figure out something." The groom was delayed, and the foolish virgins found that their lamps were going out. They now realized that they were in serious trouble. The other five virgins had chosen to think outside the box—they carried an extra flask of oil alongside their lamps. Even when the bridegroom did not come on time, they had nothing to worry about. They were prepared for any future contingencies.

The oil in this parable is meant to represent the joy of following Christ amid life's pleasure and pain; ease and difficulties. The coming of the bridegroom is the coming of the Kingdom. We do not know when and at what hour that will be. Our burning lamp can be sustained by a prayerful life, good deeds, giving ears to the cry of God's children, and stretching out hands to those in need. It could also be sustained by recognizing God's work in the world. We are the light of the world. This parable invites us to live a life of celebratory anticipation by being awake, vigilant, and most importantly hopeful.
