Reflection for the Solemnity of Christ the King

A Sunday School teacher told the Good Samaritan story to the class and then asked the children, "What would you do if you were walking on the road and saw a person who was terribly beaten and bruised and covered with blood?" One little girl answered, "I'd probably throw up! So the next question is, what do you do after you have thrown up?"

Today more and more people do not believe in the power of God. There is a strong movement to replace God with science and nature. At other times, humans assume we are the measure of all things. We judge what is right and wrong and preside over our cases.

The solemnity of Christ, the King of the universe, was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to counter the world's tendency to adopt communism and secularism after the First World War and banish God. In April 1944, Bonhoeffer a German Protestant theologian famous for his support of ecumenism and his view of Christianity's role in a secular world wrote: "We are moving toward a completely religion-less time; people, as they are now simply, cannot be religious anymore. Even those who honestly describe themselves as 'religious' do not in the least act up to it, and so they presumably mean something quite different by 'religious.' He wrote about the German Christians who refused to speak up against Hitler. Today his words echo among Christians to whom personal political or religious agenda matters more than the imitation of Christ, who is Lord of all—who died on the cross to change the way the world thinks.

The feast of Christ the King comes at the end of the liturgical year to celebrate the realization of all our theology. God is the alpha and omega. He is in control of all that is. Christ has conquered darkness, sin, death, and all the forces of this world, and he is crowned as King. Each of the readings this weekend presents Christ as the Messiah-King. He is not a king according to the standard of the world. He is the King of truth and life. He brings us to birth in his kingdom through baptism and has given us the way to live in that kingdom. The kingdom that Christ inaugurates is love, peace, and joy. Therefore, we overcome evil with goodness and love.
