Reflection for the Twenty-six Sunday in Ordinary Time

A mother was beginning to worry about her 14-year-old daughter. The girl was just becoming aware of her own femininity. She was spending almost all her time on fashion Web sites and all her allowance buying cosmetics and perfume. One day the girl came into the kitchen and the mother was overwhelmed by the smell of her perfume. "Honey," she said, "I told you that you are using too much perfume. You just need a touch. I can smell you a mile away. "The girl protested, "But mom I love this perfume. It's called Beautiful, and whenever I wear it, I feel beautiful. I am beautiful." "Fine," said the mother, "but I'd like you to buy some perfume called Obedience."

The story we read in the Gospel this weekend presents us with two children. Stories of two children of different lifestyles are common in the Bible. For example, the two sons, in the prodigal son story (Luke 15:11-32); the story of Cain and Abel (Genesis 4:1-16); the Story of Jacob and Esau (Genesis:25:23-28). Although these stories frequently refer to male siblings, they also imply female siblings. The first impression about these siblings is that they are imperfect in their roles.

The first son in our story this weekend said "no" to his father, but then changed his mind and did what his father asked. The second son said "yes" to his father's request but did nothing. In everyday life, there is a struggle with obedience and disobedience, good and bad and this struggle takes various twists. Moreover, the Bible is flooded with stories of conversions. Some people like Paul on the road to Damascus appear to be converted immediately, while others like Nicodemus take some time to reflect on the direction of their lives. Very often when people discover that their life is going in the wrong direction they change and follow a different direction. Saint Augustine for instance, lived his early life in sin, but then changed and said yes to God and went on to become one of the greatest teachers of faith. Also, Francis of Assisi began his life in a privileged family. He was entrapped in self-indulgence but then changed to live a life of simplicity and service. What ultimately counts is not where one life begins, but the action that one takes. Our past does not determine our future. Our history is not our destiny. A sin can be forgiven. A flaw can be mended. A life can be changed. Through our Baptism, we are part of a community where sinners become saints daily. It is never too late. Mercy never runs out. With God's help, our worst "no" can become a clear and glorious "ves."


