# FROM THE PASTOR ....

### FR. LINUS UMOREN, C.M.

### Reflection for the Twenty–Fourth Sunday of the Year- A

A man buys a parrot and brings him home. But the parrot starts insulting him and gets really nasty, so the man picks up the parrot and tosses him into the freezer to teach him a lesson. He hears the bird squawking for a few minutes, but suddenly, the parrot is quiet. The man opens the freezer door, the parrot walks out, looks up at him, and says, "I apologize for offending you, and I humbly ask your forgiveness. "The man says, "Well, thank you. I forgive you. "The parrot then says, "If you don't mind my asking, what did the chicken do?"

I wonder how many people have been able to keep record of offenses against them. As much as this would be a good subject for research, it may not be emotionally healthy to keep such records. Our uniqueness, incompleteness, and vulnerability continue to challenge our relationships. Therefore, to get our relationships on the right course, we constantly negotiate around the feelings of others. Sometimes we get it right; and other times we don't. It is when we don't get it right that people feel offended. Nevertheless, it is the act of negotiation that warrants apology and forgiveness.

Peter's question to Jesus in this weekend's gospel reading is not surprising given the above description of the human nature and the dynamic of relationship. "Peter approached Jesus and asked him, 'Lord if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" (Matthew 18:21 NAB). Although it would be mean to keep score of people's sins against us, some people argue that being mindful of the hurts from people and what they can potentially do against us is good for relationship. But Jesus response to Peter's question takes the focus away from oneself to the need of the community or family. The Rabbis in Jesus time taught that one could forgive three times but no more. Peter perhaps put forward the number seven as an exhaustive gift of forgiveness. Yet, with a veiled reference to the law of vengeance, Jesus insists that forgiveness is a gift from God, and we are dispensers of this gift. God is extravagant in his mercy. Although we are not God, we are invited to participate in the divine life in dealing with each other.

A second dimension that demands our curiosity is that forgiveness does not necessarily begin with the offenders repenting of their offense and asking for forgiveness. Rather, the process of forgiveness is more generative if the offended offers a room for the process of forgiveness to set in. Such openness to forgive is often transformative to the offender. It transforms the offender from feeling like a victim to becoming a survivor. Retaliation which is usually our natural tendency in responding to the offender always opens the door to unexpected and regrettable events. But God's way is the way of mercy.





# DID YOU KNOW...

That "the Creed is the spiritual seal, our hearts' meditation and an ever-present guardian; it is, unquestionably, the treasure of our soul." *St. Ambrose (See CCC, 185-197)* 

### APOSTLES' CREED

The Apostles' Creed is the epitome of Christian doctrine. In twelve articles, it contains the truths taught by the Apostles. It has existed essentially since the second century and was first referred to in the fourth century. The earliest text dates from the eighth century. Developed by early Church councils, it was adopted in its present form in the eleventh century. Since the early centuries of the Western Church, catechumens were required to learn and recite it before Baptism.

### NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed was a response to the Arian heresy, which denied the divinity of Christ. It takes its name from the city of Nicaea, where an ecumenical council was held in A.D. 325. At this council Saint Athanasius, a doctor of the Church, defended the divinity of Christ. Subsequent to the meeting in Nicaea, the original creed underwent some changes – at meetings in Constantinople in A.D. 381 and Chalcedon in A.D. 450. The Nicene Creed is the only Christian creed accepted in common as authoritative by the Catholic, Orthodox, Anglican, and major Protestant Churches.

### ATHANASIAN CREED

This creed receives its title from the fact that it embodies Athanasius's theology of the Trinity. Composed by Hilary, bishop of Arles in the fifth century, it is common doctrinal ground – along with the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds – for both Catholics and Anglicans. It is characterized by its extraordinary length and its anathemas against any who would deny the doctrines it professes. Its Latin title is its opening word, *Quicemque* ("He who with this..."): "If anyone wishes to be saved, before everything else he must hold the Catholic faith."
