FROM THE PASTOR...

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: A

Eleven people were hanging on a rope under a helicopter, 10 men and one woman. The rope was not strong enough to carry them all, so they decided that one had to leave, because otherwise they were all going to fall. They couldn't decide which person would make the ultimate sacrifice until the woman gave a very touching speech.

She said that she would voluntarily let go of the rope because, as a woman, she was used to giving up everything for her husband and kids, or for men in general, and was used to always making sacrifices with little in return. As soon as she finished her speech, all the men started clapping their hands.

What a journey! Last week Peter was named the Rock. Suddenly in this week's Gospel he hits rock bottom. When Jesus asked the disciples who they said he is, Peter responded with excellence: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God." This week instead is about how Jesus lives his messianic vocation through the cross. But it about this messianic option that Peter fails to understand.

No one wants to hear that a loved one is diagnosed with a terminal illness that will probably kill the person sooner than later. I remember encountering a 55-year-old female patient in the hospital. She was diagnosed with cancer, which she chose not to treat with chemotherapy. The treatment would prolong her life for sometimes but with suffering, which she was unwilling to undergo. Her best friend sitting by her bedside tried to persuade her to accept the treatment but to no avail. Pain, sickness, and death are not friendly. No one desires them by choice.

When Jesus Christ says in the gospel this weekend, that he must go to Jerusalem to suffer and be killed, it was not great news for the disciples. Thus, Peter rebuked him. This rebuke is about Peter's refusal to acknowledge the cross as a necessary component of Jesus' mission.

Like Peter in this context, we all seek comfort, good life, and victory over our foes. But the cross of Jesus stands in contrast to these human desires. Consequently, our problem is the cross. And this is not only for us but also to the Jews for whom the cross was a stumbling block and to the Gentiles for whom the cross was foolishness (1 Corinthians 1:23). On the contrary, Christian discipleship is about the cross. Unfortunately, the Christian life is not just about being witnesses to Christ's suffering but also participating in it. Therefore, in our pain, we unite with Jesus Christ. The memories of his suffering transforms us by enlightening our minds and strengthening our hearts.


